The Technical Assistance to Strengthen Capabilities (TASC) project, funded by UK aid, responded to priority requests for support to the Scaling Up Nutrition (SUN) Movement and the SUN Movement Secretariat (SMS) and to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) from September 2020 to December 2021. TASC was a follow-on TA facility from the Maximising the Quality of Scaling Up Nutrition Plus (MQSUN+) programme (2015-2020) and as such followed the same approach established under MQSUN+.

Support to SUN Governance

 Knowledge Management and Learning This brief describes the support provided to the SUN Movement which covered four thematic areas including i) Country capacity strengthening for nutrition (4); ii) Development of country priorities for action (4), iii) Support to SUN Governance (4), and iv) Knowledge Management and Learning (3).

The TASC project responded to 15 requests from SUN Movement to help maximise the quality and effectiveness of its nutrition-related policy and planning, to support evidence generation, lesson learning and to develop nutrition capacity.

Many of these deliverables are held in soft copy by the SUN country focal points (SUN FP), multistakeholder platforms (MSP) and SUN Movement Secretariat (SMS). They are not available on the public domain, but can be requested through the contact persons at SMS or directly with the country SUN FPs.





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Country Capacity Strengthening for Nutrition

Four assignments aimed to strengthen capacity at country level for improving national planning processes (National Nutrition Plan review), equipping countries with the right tools (costing model), enabling participation in global processes (São Tomé), or Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) of Functional Capacity Strengthening (FCS).

National Nutrition Plan (NNP) review

To review the NNPs of 13 countries using the **SUN Good Plans Checklist** to advise countries where existing or future NNPs might be strengthened and support SMS to monitor existing NNPs.


