

360 generators to




EDUCATION

Keeping kindergartens, schools, Department of Education district offices, and special education institutes open. Some of the schools have been used as IDP temporary shelters as well as air raid shelters.



COMMUNITY COHESION.

Strengthening community cohesion and resilience. Recipients have included youth centers, IDP shelters, vocational training centers, orphanages.



GOVERNANCE

Supplying power to city and village council buildings. Offsetting the energy needs in administrative services centers, utilities offices, water supply facilities, electricity stations, heating stations.



MUNICIPAL SAFETY

Strengthening municipal safety and emergency response. Ensuring services provision by local fire departments, regional military administrations, State Emergency Services firefighting and rescue units, police departments, and voluntary civil defense centers.

HEALTHCARE

Ensuring uninterrupted work of local healthcare system. Supporting district hospitals, primary health care centers, paramedic and midwifery points, regional centers of emergency medical aid, regional children's hospitals, and outpatient clinics.



To date, over **1,806,000** citizens in **65** municipalities of Lviv, Odesa, Poltava, Rivne, Volyn, Zakarpattia, Zhytomyr Oblasts have benefited from USAID HOVERLA support
